IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Pupil premium

If your family is in receipt of certain benefits, your child may be eligible for Pupil Premium funding (currently £1345) that the Government provides to schools for them to spend on that child. This could be one-to-one teaching time, special equipment, paying for out-of-school activities that benefit the child, paying for school trips and music lessons, to name a few examples.

Exciting Summer Updates

We are really excited to tell you about the improvements which have taken place over the summer, all funded by the MAT or the Government.

Firstly, just before we broke up, the JTMAT informed us that they would be funding the remaining 4 whiteboards required for our classrooms. As you are aware, the PTA have been fundraising for these for quite some time and have already purchased 2. This means that all classrooms now have new, touch screen boards which we are all so pleased about.

Next, we had some major works to complete the refurbishment of our school hall after the redecoration and new curtains and blinds earlier this year. This summer has seen the addition of a new heating system, a new, fully insulated ceiling and a sanded and polished floor which looks stunning. For those of you who have sat in our school hall, the heating will make such a difference.

Finally, we have had our boilers to the main building replaced with much more energy efficient and modern boilers. Being an old school, our energy costs are enormous so these measures will hopefully have a positive impact on our budget, meaning more money going back into teaching and learning.
