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Gardens for Schools

Please can you help us to get free gardening products for our school? Gardens for Schools is a scheme run by Byrkley Garden Centre. For every £10 you spend at the garden centre or coffee shop you can collect a Gardens for Schools voucher. For every 250 vouchers that we collect we are able to exchange them for a £100 garden centre voucher to spend on garden products that we can use in school.



Vouchers can either be brought into the school office or posted in the PTA box outside. We are very excited to collect the vouchers because we have big plans for developing and enlarging our forest school area over the coming months.


